CAPTAIN TED J. CAMAISA Dental Corps United States Navy (ret)

The son of a US Navy logistics officer, Captain Ted Camaisa grew up on naval bases in Yokosuka, Japan; Patuxent River, Maryland, and Athens, Georgia. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree from San Diego State University in 1985 and a Doctor of Dental Surgery degree from the University of California, San Francisco in 1989. While in dental school he was enrolled in the 1925I dental student program and was commissioned a lieutenant upon graduation.



Captain Camaisa was first assigned to Naval Dental Center, Camp Pendleton, California where he served as clinic director, Edson Range Dental Clinic. He was transferred to the USS Cape Cod (AD-43) in Dubai, United Arab Emirates, to support coalition surface forces during Operation Desert Storm. While returning from the Persian Gulf, he received a humanitarian award for aiding in disaster relief efforts in the Asia Pacific Region. He coordinated the 'Partners in Education' program with local schools and was recognized by the United Way for his volunteer efforts.
